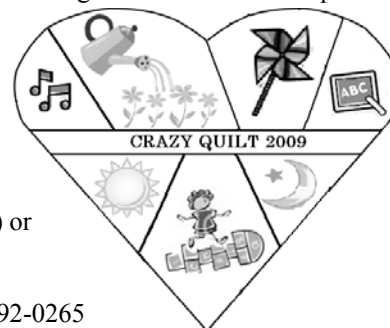


CRAZY QUILT 2009

SESSION 1 (9:00 AM - 10:30 AM)

Garden Art - # 9230

Bring some fun into the backyard. Your girls will want to learn how to make these unique wind chimes, bird feeder and other whimsical art for their gardens.

Pocketful of Program 6 (New) - # 9231

You've been waiting for this one! All new quick and easy program activities to pull from your "pocket" when an idea is needed fast. A kit of program cards is provided.

From Sidewalks to Treetops - # 9232

(Repeat from ETC 2007)

Through a video and actual tour, we will do some fun activities that will help you gain confidence in exploring wildlife and plant life almost anywhere. You will enjoy this workshop even if you don't know an ant from an aardvark or live in a concrete jungle!

Nature Hikes - # 9233

Ever wonder what you could do with the girls on a hike to make it special? This workshop will give you hiking themes, songs to sing, and games to play while you hike. You'll learn to recognize trees and other plants along the way.

Flag Ceremonies & Etiquette - # 9234

Learn the correct way to conduct a variety of flag ceremonies. Get information on how to display, fold and retire a flag. Course includes what to do with a worn flag.

SESSION 2 (10:45 AM - 12:15 PM)

S.W.A.P.S. - # 9235

Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere or Shared With A Pal, S.W.A.P.S. are fun handmade items that girls and adults can share as a sign of friendship. Come create and learn about some great swap ideas to share with your girls.

Best Kept Secrets - # 9236

Need a slide projector for your service unit meeting? Do you know you can rent a Dutch oven for only fifty cents? Where can you locate interesting information about Juliette Low? Learn what resources GSSJC has available for both girl and adult members. Also examine ways to utilize the internet to enhance troop program.

Day Camp Songs - # 9237

Learn the fun songs everyone sings at camp. You may want to bring your tape recorder with extra batteries and tapes for this session.

Remember When Games - # 9238

(Repeat from ETC 2007)

Have fun learning (or refreshing your memory) on games like Tinikling, Lemmi Sticks and other activities Girl Scouts have played through the years.

No More Bullies! (New) - # 9239

This course will provide information about and strategies for handling bullying. Materials will be discussed that include activities to build girls' skills so that they can prevent and deal with bullying and help them engage their power in positive ways to become leaders, not bullies.

SESSION 3 (1:15 PM TO 2:45 PM)

Grab Bag (New) - # 9240

Workshop teaches a potpourri of fun, almost-no-cost activities to do with your girls at meetings or in the outdoors. You'll learn gimmicks that will make your girls scream for more.

Let's Talk: Communicating with Teens - # 9241

This course is designed to teach supportive, friendly, and effective methods of communicating with your teenager. Gain a better understanding of them, how to cope with them, and some ways to direct their turbulent lives to make for a more harmonious home.

S.T.E.M. - Easy as 1-2-3! - # 9242

Come learn easy, fun, hands-on activities to help your girls explore Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. You don't need to be a rocket scientist to encourage the natural curiosity in your girls. Included in this course will be a beaker full of ideas and resources to help both you and your girls enjoy the exciting world of S.T.E.M.

Program on a Shoestring 2 (New) - # 9243

This workshop will give you fun program activities on "a shoestring" to do with your girls. You will get great ideas that will help you teach the girls to have a great time while "using their resources wisely."

S'More About Cooperation - # 9244

Join us in this fun, participatory workshop filled with games and activities aimed at team building and communication skills. You will leave with activities your girls will love and bring the troop closer together.

SESSION 4 (3:00 PM - 4:30 PM)

Snack Attack - # 9245

Want your troop to learn creative ways to cook during your troop meeting? Do you think not having a kitchen means you can't cook? Discover ways to make both hot and cold snacks using common small appliances. You can even sample your creations.

Until We Meet Again - # 9246

This course covers end-of-the-year ceremonies for all ages; includes bridging, fly-up, court of awards, and Cookie Sale awards.

Traditions in Day Camp - # 9247
This fun workshop covers knife safety, cadence calls, food, lashing, crafts, and lots more that have become “traditions” at day and twilight camps.

Helping Girls Thrive - # 9248

Many things you do every day make a big difference for kids. How? by building “developmental assets” – 40 essential building blocks that children

need to thrive. We’ll explore what assets are, why they’re needed and how everyone can become an asset builder so that girls grow up caring, competent and responsible.
